FINANCIAL AID

- In order to register for the summer term, students must complete the registration form from the Registrar and an Office of the Bursar Summer School Worksheet. If you wish to apply for financial aid, you must complete the Summer School Financial Aid Application. Norwich students can make credit card or electronic check payments by visiting the Bursar's web pages. Summer school students who are **not** Norwich students should call the Bursar's Office at 802-485-2055 for assistance.
- Financial aid must be secured by the payment due date.

A student may be eligible for a Pell Grant, a Federal Direct Subsidized/Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, a Federal Direct PLUS Loan, an Alternative Loan, and/or Federal Work Study during summer school. To be considered, a student must complete a Summer School Financial Aid Application and drop it off at the Student Financial Planning Office. In addition, the student must:

- Be enrolled in at least six credit hours taken at Norwich University.
- Complete the FAFSA form by April 1.

Changes in your enrollment in any session may result in a change in your eligibility for Financial Aid. If you drop to fewer than six credits after your aid is disbursed, it may result in you owing a refund back to the University.
